Secretary **Ally T-G.** presented the May 26, 2026 Intergroup Business Meeting minutes.

TREASURER'S FINANCIAL REPORT

Treasurer **Trina S.** presented the financial report as of May 31, 2026.

- Revenue: \$22,439
- Expenses: \$20,250
- Change in Net Assets: \$2,225
- Cash Balance: \$61,046

GROUP HISTORY — Clayton Valley Men's Group — Presented by David R.

- Tuesdays, 7:30–8:30 PM at St. John's Church in Clayton
- Founded September 2, 1980 by seven guys
- Speaker/discussion format with birthday celebrations the last Tuesday each month.
- Originated alongside a companion AA/Al-Anon meeting that operated for approximately ten years.
- Strong emphasis on fellowship, camaraderie, laughter and love.

TOPIC PRESENTATION — How to Start a New Meeting — Presented by Christy S. and Roxy C.

- A presentation was given on the formation of See You Next Tuesday, an LGBTQ+ women's meeting held Tuesdays at St. Timothy's through the Danville Fellowship.
- The meeting began informally at a member's home after its founders recognized a need for an LGBTQ+ women's meeting.
- They developed a mission statement through self-reflection, with the central goal of carrying the A.A. message to people who may otherwise feel left out.
- The founders consulted with sponsors and experienced A.A. members to consider how the meeting could support the growth and accessibility of A.A.

- Finding an appropriate location was one of the greatest challenges. Personal connections led them to the Danville Fellowship Steering Committee, which helped secure meeting space, obtain literature, and establish a prudent reserve.
- The group discussed Tradition Four and whether the new meeting would retain sufficient autonomy while operating within an established fellowship.
- The founders developed the meeting format, script, service positions, and initial agenda topics. Planning began in November, and the first meeting was held in April.
- The meeting is now well attended and continuing to grow.
- Key lessons included allowing room to make mistakes and learn, practicing Rule 62, trusting the collective wisdom of A.A. members, and recognizing the considerable time and effort required to establish a new meeting.
- In response to questions, the presenters explained that initial outreach was primarily through word of mouth. A member noted that groups typically wait approximately three months before being added to the local meeting schedule.
- Registration required contacting multiple A.A. service entities, including General Service, the Contra Costa Service Center, and the Danville Fellowship.

OLD BUSINESS

Special Election – Public Information Chair

- Chair Alice S. opened nominations for the vacant Public Information Chair position.
- Doug H. (Monday Night Life of Sobriety) made himself available for service.
- Marilyn M. agreed to assist as part of the committee.

Motion: Elect Doug H. as Public Information Chair. | **Second:** Received. | **Result:** Motion approved.

Doug H. briefly introduced himself and shared his qualifications following the election.

NEW BUSINESS

Suggested Contributions to AA Services (Trina S.)

- Trina S. provided an update on the suggested contribution guidelines for A.A. service entities.
- Trina explained that, in response to concerns and feedback raised at the previous Intergroup meeting, the suggested guidelines would be aligned with the distribution described in A.A. literature: 50% to Intergroup, 30% to the General Service Office, 10% to the Area, and 10% to the District. This change is intended to promote consistency and transparency while addressing members' concerns regarding the previous 70% recommendation.
- Members questioned whether the change should be discussed and approved by the larger Intergroup body before being implemented. Cyn explained that the guidelines are advisory only and do not constitute a policy or required distribution. Each group remains autonomous and retains the authority to determine how its Seventh Tradition funds are distributed.
- Other members agreed that the guidelines are suggestions and do not limit group autonomy.
- Trina explained that the contribution guidelines were reviewed alongside the Service Center's pamphlet practices. Pamphlets represent an expense to the Service Center, and the previous practice of providing them without charge had been applied inconsistently. The goal is to establish a fair, consistent, and transparent practice for all groups and members.
- Concern was raised about small or financially struggling groups that may have little or no money remaining after paying rent and other operating expenses. Trina stated that groups unable to afford pamphlets or make contributions are encouraged to speak with the Service Center Manager or IOC so their individual circumstances can be considered.
- Members asked whether pamphlet expenses could be reported separately from other literature expenses. Cyn explained that the current reporting structure does not separate pamphlets from literature. However, once the new QuickBooks sales system is fully implemented, each item sold will be tracked individually, allowing for more detailed reporting.
- Cyn also discussed the Service Center's ordering practices and noted that literature and pamphlet sales generate a limited margin, which is further reduced when the Service Center absorbs credit-card transaction fees and sales tax.
- One member observed that both contributions and pamphlet purchases ultimately come from a group's Seventh Tradition funds, whether the group contributes 70% and receives pamphlets without charge or contributes 50% and purchases pamphlets separately.
- Members questioned how reducing the suggested Intergroup contribution from 70% to 50% might affect Service Center revenue and services.
- A cost analysis was requested to compare the potential revenue generated under the 70% and 50% contribution guidelines. Cyn explained that such an analysis would require the assumption that all groups currently contribute 70%. The Service Center cannot determine whether that is the case and does not have the authority to require or verify how individual groups allocate their contributions.

Trina concluded by reiterating that the review is intended to acknowledge past inconsistencies and support the continued development of fair, clear, and transparent practices.

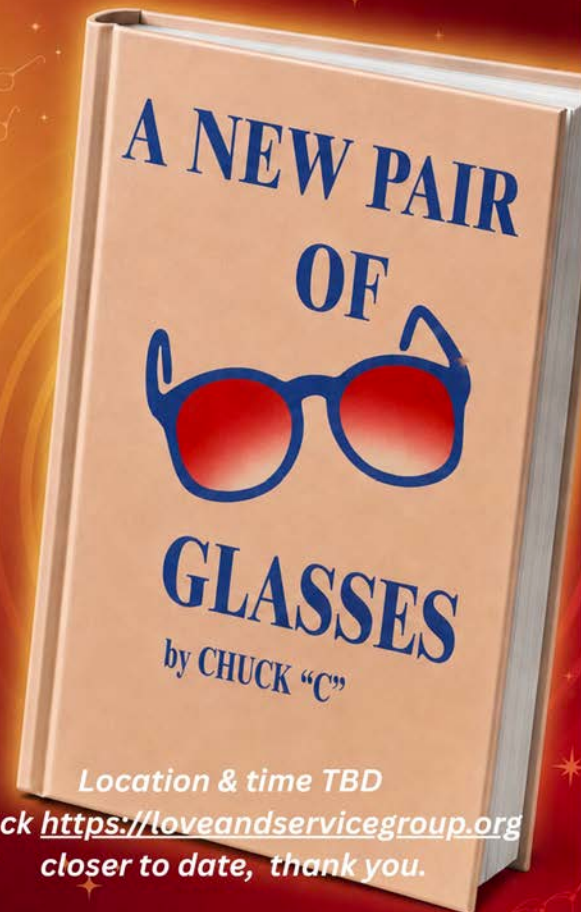
